- e. Notional CONOPS of the solution: A description of the solution, including methods and system information (data, software, algorithms, etc.), with sections addressing each of the CONOPS scoring criteria: (1) Capability; (2) Data, Methods, Dissemination; and (3) Innovation and Commercialization
- f. An annotated graphic/schematic, illustrating the CONOPS
- g. Conclusion summarizing at a minimum, the solution; what qualifies it as novel; its feasibility with current resources, or its feasibility with the addition of resources, including such things as data, infrastructure, and labor; and rationale for why the U.S. Government should invest in additional R&D to realize the solution
- h. Cited references
- i. 1-inch margins all around
- j. Single spaced
- k. 12-point Times New Roman font
- I. No more than 2 columns of text per page
- m. No links to external websites
- n. Written in English
- o. Define all acronyms
- p. Use clear, concise, and grammatically correct language

q. Use scientific/evidence-based language
